COURSE SYLLABUS

This document serves as an **addendum** to the previous syllabus students received at the start of the semester, and where applicable, **revises** previous classroom policies as it relates to the information outlined below. Policies and procedures not addressed below may also undergo revision if they are not in the best interests of students, given the transition in leadership taking place.

Course Description:

The second semester of Myths & Legends will focus on Science Fiction and Fantasy. This is a rigorous and interactive course that requires reading of various books, short stories and other texts plus active participation in activities including class discussion, group work, pair work and Reader's Theater. Students will write both critically and creatively. Written essays will emphasize argumentation and analysis. Assessments of student understanding of material will occur on a regular basis. While this course is aligned with the 12th grade Language Arts Common Core framework, it is modeled and taught as a college-level humanities course that introduces and intersects with topics that are often considered controversial and/or objectionable for some audiences, as evidenced by mature readings, R-rated films and classroom discussions. As a result, collegiate maturity is expected from the student, and similar support is required from the parent/guardian.
